# waste from accommodation facilities is managed properly.



### Proper waste disposal is a responsibility of business operators.

Waste produced from accommodation facilities,\*1 including vacation rental properties (private lodging or minpaku), is classified as commercial waste,\*2 not household waste. Business operators are responsible for handling commercial waste properly, which must be sorted according to the Waste Management Law and disposed of via, for example, entrusted licensed collection agents.

In dealing with waste, please consider the environment of the neighborhood, and make an effort to maintain a good relationship with the residents of the area.

- \*1 If you provide accommodation as a business by receiving money that is considered as a lodging charge, you must either receive permission as prescribed in Article 3 of the Travel Agency Act, or make a notification as prescribed in Article 3 of the Private Lodging Business Act. This also applies to anyone offering a private property or an untenanted house, in whole or in part, as commercial lodgings.
- \*2 Waste produced in the process of managing or operating accommodation properties is also classified as commercial waste.



# <u>Donotidiscard commercial waster</u> as household waster.

Discarding of commercial waste at a household waste collection site is not permitted.

Illegal dumping shall lead to imprisonment of up to five years, a fine of up to 10,000,000 yen (in the case of a company, up to 300,000,000 yen), or both.





# An illegal dumping case involving **minpaku** operators was sent to the prosecutor's office.

On May 31, 2017, papers were filed with prosecutors against a real estate agency and its former employees in Sakyo Ward. They allegedly dumped waste from their vacation rentals at a waste collection spot on condominium premises in Shimogyo Ward.




#### What is commercial waste?

Any waste produced in the process of business activities is commercial waste.

Business activities mean the whole activities conducted by businesses such as retailers, companies, restaurants, Japanese-style inns, hotels, and factories.

Commercial waste is classified into two categories: the 21 types of industrial wastes designated by the Waste Management Law, and general commercial waste. The methods of collection, transportation, and disposal of these wastes are also specified in the law.



#### yes of waste

Separate waste produced in accommodation facilities properly according to type before discarding (see the reverse side).

Use a colorless transparent or white translucent bag when discarding general commercial waste.

Type	Main waste items
General commercial waste	Kitchen waste (e.g., leftovers, coffee grounds), disposable wooden chopsticks, non-recyclable paper (e.g., paper container for noodles and ice cream, used tissues), etc.
Industrial waste	Plastics (bento lunch containers, containers for noodles, packages for snack food, foamed styrene, etc.,), cans, bottles, PET bottles, *3 glass, ceramics, metals, etc.
Recyclable paper*4	Newspaper, cardboards, magazines, fliers, brochures, paper boxes, wrapping paper, paper bags, paper packages, etc.

- \*3 Entrust to disposal operators specializing in industrial waste management or recycling businesses. Please recycle cans and bottles as they are recyclables.
- \*4 Separating recyclable paper is compulsory in Kyoto City. Discarding recyclable paper as general commercial waste is not permitted.



## Proper discarding procedures of waste from accommodation facilities

# Carrying waste to disposal facilities

Only business operators themselves or licensed collection agents are allowed to transport general commercial or industrial wastes from accommodation facilities or waste storages to disposal facilities.

#### **General commercial waste**

Waste produced in the process of business activities, and categorized as among the 21 types of wastes designated by the Waste Management Law.

Waste produced in the process of business activities, but not categorized as industrial waste.



#### Recyclable paper

Industrial waste

Please consult with the licensed collection agent (general/industrial) you contract. It is also possible to use a waste paper collector or to bring recyclable paper to a recycling company by yourself.

## \* Transporting waste from accommodation facilities to own storages

It is business operators' responsibility to transport general commercial or industrial wastes from their accommodation

facilities to their own storages.



Accommodation facilities

Waste produced in the process of business activities



Own storage



Do not entrust unauthorized waste transportation agents.

Commission of waste disposal must be limited to an authorized waste management agent. If you entrust collection/transportation/disposal of commercial waste to an unauthorized agent, you shall be punished with imprisonment of up to five years, a fine of up to 10,000,000 yen, or both.
